During Mayor Hardberger's tenure as San Antonio Mayor from 2005-2009, he carried an approval rating of 86% and captured 77% of the vote during his re-election. The City changed the name of Voelcker Farm to Phill Hardberger Park, a 330-acre nature and fitness-oriented park that includes hike and bike trails, dog parks, picnic areas, basketball courts, multi-use fields and savannah restoration.
